# SEASONAL PRINTS PENGUIN PALS PLATE



## MATERIALS

DB24807 Geometrix Lg. Sq. Plate  
Liner Brush  
Detail Brush  
Medium Brush  
Pencil or Water-Based Marker  
Writing Bottle

## COLORS

CMM 64- Sky Blue  
CMM 11 - Blue Lagoon  
CMM 69 - Carrot Juice CMM  
62 - Just Blue  
CMM 67 - Snowflake  
CMM 31 - Licorice

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## INSTRUCTIONS

This piece can be made with any combination of colors or number of prints. Below are the instructions for how this exact piece was made, but make it your own to fit your needs!

1. For the penguin that is facing forward; use a medium brush to apply a generous coat of Licorice to the right foot, leaving an oval in the center unpainted (this will create the white belly)
2. Place the foot where desired on the plate and press firmly.
3. For the penguin facing sideways; use a brush to apply a generous coat of Licorice to the left foot.
4. Place the foot where desired on the plate and press firmly.
5. If desired, sketch the elements onto the plate before painting.
6. Use a liner brush to apply the wings and belly with 2 coats of Licorice.
7. To create the eye, use a detail brush to make a larger dot of Snowflake. When that dries, dip the handle of the liner brush into Licorice and stamp a dot onto the white eye.
8. Use a writer bottle with Carrot Juice (or a liner brush) and apply triangle beaks.
9. Paint an area of ice around the penguins using a medium brush and one coat of Just Blue.
10. Sketch the names and sentiment with a pencil or a water-based marker.
11. Use a writer bottle with Sky Blue to apply the words "We love you" and "much".
12. Next, use a write bottle with Blue Lagoon to apply the word "Snow" and the names underneath the penguins.
13. Finally use a liner brush to apply snowflakes around the plate. To do this simply paint an asterisk.

## TIPS

- When sketching in pencil for the writing, gently rub back and forth over the pencil lines to remove excess graphite. This will make it easier to write on top of it.
- For the writing bottle, only fill the bottle 1/2 way to avoid it coming out too fast. This will help with smaller writing.
- Get the writer bottle flowing on a paper towel before you write on your piece. This will work out any air and sputtering that might occur.

\*\* These samples don't have a year painted on them, we suggest putting the year somewhere on the plate.

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
